

Fly of the Month

I came up with this fly while I was living in Northeast Oregon almost 10 years ago. My roommates and I were fishing steelhead on the Wallowa River in very low clear water and realized that to catch fish you had to fish small flies. We noticed there were tons of small cased caddis living in the river and were wondering if a pattern imitating caddis would work on steelhead. Well it worked very well and we caught many steelhead that year and the next. Not only does this fly catch steelhead but it works extremely well for trout from cutthroat trou in coastal streams, rainbows on the lower Deschutes River, and even browns and rainbow in the Montana rivers.

After fishing this pattern for a year or so I still did not have a name for it. One day I showed a friend this fly while we were fishing steelhead on the lower Grande Ronde River and he told me it was the ugliest fly he had ever seen. So he called it the "Ugly Vonderohe Caddis" and for some reason the name stuck, probably because we couldn't come up with a better name. To shorten up the name we now just call it the UVC.

Tying instructions

Step 1: Secure the thread to the hook and then wrap the lead wire around the hook



Step 2: Tie in the Silver Chenille to the back of the hook and then create a dubbing loop that will be used for the "Over" body. Wind the thread to the eye of the hook. Wrap chenille up towards the eye of the hook and secure.

Step 3: Add beaver dubbing (or dubbing of your choose) to the dubbing loop. Spin the dubbing loop tight and pick the dubbing to give it webby look.



Step 4: Wrap the dubbing forward over the top of the chenille. Keep the wraps loose enough that some of the silver chenille shows through the dubbing. Tie off the dubbing at the same spot as the chenille.

Step 5: Dub the thread with the Yellow Antron and make three or four wraps at the head of the fly. Whip finish and go catch fish.



Hook: Tiemco 100 size 12-14

Thread: 8/0 Uni-Thread in Gray

Weight: Lead wire 0.020

Underbody: Silver Chenille

"Over" body: Brown dubbing of choose (I use beaver)

Head: Yellow Antron dubbing
